David P. Stewart serves as Professor from Practice, Director of Georgetown's Global Law Scholars Program, and Co-Director of its Center on Transnational Business and the Law. He teaches courses in public and private international law, foreign relations law, international immunities, and international criminal law and civil litigation.

Before joining the faculty at Georgetown, David had a long and distinguished career at the State Department, where he served as Assistant Legal Adviser for Diplomatic Law and Litigation, for African Affairs, for Human Rights and Refugees, for Law Enforcement and Intelligence, for International Claims and Investment Disputes, and for Private International Law, as well as Special Assistant to the Legal Adviser.

The American Law Institute has selected David to serve as Co-Reporter for Restatement of the Law (Fourth), Foreign Relations Law of the United States. He currently serves on the Inter-American Juridical Committee, which advises the Organization of American States on juridical matters of an international nature and promotes the progressive development and the codification of international law. He is President of the American Branch of the International Law Association and a member of the Board of Editors of the American Journal of International Law, the Executive Council of the American Society of International Law, and the Secretary of State's Advisory Committee on Private International Law. He previously served on the Executive Council of the ABA's Section of International Law.
