Gabriel Eckstein focuses his research on water, natural resources, and environmental law and policy issues at the local, national, and international levels. He regularly teaches Water Law, Oil & Gas Law, Law & Science, and Property Law, and has also taught Water Pollution Law, International Water Law, International Environmental Law, and Public International Law. He also serves as a faculty member of the Texas A&M Water Management and Hydrological Science Graduate Faculty as well as the Texas A&M Energy Institute.

In addition, Professor Eckstein: has served as an expert advisor and consultant for various UN agencies, non-governmental organizations, and other groups on US and international environmental and water law issues; directs the Internet-based International Water Law Project (www.InternationalWaterLaw.org); serves as an Associate Editor for *Brill Research Perspectives: International Water Law* and on the Editorial Board of the *Journal of Water Law*; and is an executive board member of both the International Association for Water Law and the International Water Resources Association. He also serves as Of Counsel with the law firm of Sullivan & Worcester.

Prior to joining Texas A&M University, Professor Eckstein held the George W. McCleskey Chair in Water Law at Texas Tech University where he also directed the Texas Tech Center for Water Law & Policy. Before entering academia, he served as senior counsel for CropLife America working on agrichemical regulation and legislative matters, and as a litigator in private practice. Professor Eckstein holds J.D. and LL.M. degrees, an M.S. in International Affairs, and a B.A. in Geology.
