For historic reasons, the Channel Islands of Jersey, Guernsey, Sark, and Alderney (located in the English Channel between the United Kingdom and France) are associated with the United Kingdom, but are not part of it. Building on this status, these islands have become international financial centers serving as gateways to Europe and the UK for non-European Union and non-UK businesses and investors. Through meetings with government officials, practitioners, representatives from the financial industry, and regulators, students will focus on the Channel Islands as a case study of how small jurisdictions can become important players in international policy, regulation, and law enforcement.
