



CLASS RANKS

Juris Doctor students are numerically ranked at the end of the fall and the spring semesters, after grades are posted. Students are placed in one of four ranking groups, based on the number of credit hours earned at the time rank is calculated.

1L Ranking Group: 0 to 30 completed hours

2L Ranking Group: 31 to 62 completed hours

3L Ranking Group: 63 or more completed hours

Graduate Ranking Group: 90 or more completed hours and completion of all program requirements

Note: August and December graduates are ranked with students who graduated the preceding May.

Texas A&M University School of Law only provides individual class ranks to all JD students at graduation. However, at the conclusion of each fall and spring semester, GPA cut-offs for the top 5%, 10%, 15%, 20%, 25%, 33%, and 50% are posted on the law school website for the 1L, 2L, and 3L ranking groups, so that students may determine their general position within the ranking group. In addition, students in the top 15% of each ranking group are notified by email of their individual class rank.

Class rank is determined by the transcribed cumulative GPA, which is rounded to the hundredths place. Individual ranks are based on the numerical sequence of students' transcribed cumulative GPA's, from highest to lowest. If two or more students have the same cumulative GPA, each receives the same rank. The position of those students ranked below them is unaffected. (If two students are tied for the number one rank, for example, the next student will be ranked number three, because there are two students with a higher GPA.)

¹ Texas A&M University School of Law adjusted its grade policy for spring 2020 in response to COVID-19 pandemic. Courses completed after 3/16/2020 were graded exclusively on a pass/fail basis. Class ranks for 2Ls, 3Ls, and graduates are based on the students' cumulative GPA through fall 2019 and total hours earned through spring 2020. For 1Ls, class ranks are based on the students' cumulative GPA through the 2020 winter session.

LATIN HONORS

J.D. students may qualify to graduate Summa Cum Laude by holding a final cumulative grade point average of 3.80 or above, Magna Cum Laude with a final cumulative grade point average of 3.60 through 3.79 and Cum Laude with a final cumulative grade point average of 3.40 through 3.59. Prior to May 1, 2019, a J.D. student who graduates in the top 2% of the graduating class is designated as graduating Summa Cum Laude; a J.D. student who is not in the top 2% but graduates in the top 5% of the graduating class is designated as graduating Magna Cum Laude, and a J.D. student who is not in the top 5% but graduates in the top 10% of the graduating class is designated as graduating Cum Laude.

² As students graduate in August or December each year, those students' class ranks will be determined based on how they compare to the preceding May graduating class, but the class rank already assigned to a May graduate will not change.
