

## Publication Opportunity

In addition to publishing the presenters' articles, Texas A&M Law Review is looking to publish one student article in response to the Symposium.

### **WHAT?**

Students may work alone or in pairs to submit a proposal for their article.

Submissions should include:

- An abstract
- An outline/summary of your argument
- Substantial relationship to/critical analysis of the Symposium overall or a specific panel discussion (similar to a book review)
- A list of sources
- If selected, a final article, between 2,000 and 5,000 words.
- Students' identifying information will be removed when their entries are sent to the selection committee.

One submission will be selected for publication.

### **WHO?**

ALL 2Ls & 3Ls, Journal membership not required!

Participants can work alone or in pairs and submit a joint publication.

### **WHERE?**

The chosen article will be published on the Law Review's online publication forum, Arguendo.

### **WHEN?**

Submissions will be accepted from the conclusion of the symposium until **March 20th at 11:59 P.M.**

All submissions will be reviewed by a committee on the Law Review, with some oversight from Professor Peter Reilly & Professor Nancy Welsh.

Chosen submission will be extended a publication offer on March 27th!

Once the submission is confirmed, a full draft of the article is due by May 13th

The Law Review hopes to publish in July 2022!
